# Minister's Article

My thoughts were preoccupied with Joseph last week. The earthly father of Jesus was the subject of study at both our men's groups and for the sermon at our 9:00 a.m. contemporary service. Though Joseph is typically overshadowed by the angels, shepherds, wise men, and Mary in the story of the nativity, he is a vital part of the narrative and serves as a role model for the following reasons:

- He is a man of <u>faith</u> (listening for and following the voice of God)
- He cares to be "right with God" (setting an <u>example</u> of spending time in God's Word)
- He is a man of <u>action</u> (remembered for "walking the walk" more than for what he says)
- He is a man of <u>restraint</u> (not abandoning Mary, though he would have been excused for doing so)
- He is a man of <u>commitment</u> and <u>provision</u> (standing by Mary and Jesus, and securing their safety when King Herod wanted Jesus dead).

I'd like to add two other aspects of Joseph's importance, both of which arose from conversations at our Thursday Journeymen's bible study. We were discussing the Old Testament Law in Deuteronomy 22 (23-27) which indicated that a marriage was in effect and binding not from the moment of the ceremony and the exchange of some kind of "vows" (as is the case today), but rather that moment of "engagement" (or better, from the moment the marriage was arranged). At that point, if a child was conceived by someone other than the husband-to-be, the husband-to-be was within his right to end the "marriage" (due to the "infidelity" that would have occurred). This was the situation in which Joseph found himself when he learned that Mary was pregnant during their engagement.

Our men suggested two parts of the story about which I had not given much thought. Perhaps, one of them said, God chose Mary for the task of bringing Jesus into the world precisely because God knew that Joseph was the kind of man who exhibited all of the characteristics described above. We ruminated on the integration of baseball in the 1940's and how Branch Rickey of the Los Angeles Dodgers chose Jackie Robinson not only for his on-field abilities but also because he had the kind of inner strength, restraint and resolve to withstand the abuse that was to come. Perhaps God knew Joseph was the kind of person who would not run away once he was made known of the whole story and that he had the courage and strength needed to be the stability Mary and Jesus would need.

Moreover, because the Law was on Joseph's side in the event that he chose to break off the engagement with Mary, the fact that he *didn't* do the very thing he was legally able to do could be seen as a way of foreshadowing the role that grace would play with the coming of Christ. Mary was not met with the full weight of the Law's judgment by Joseph but by a full measure of grace. Joseph didn't do what he could have done but chose to treat Mary with forgiveness over judgment. With the coming of Christ, we are shown that we will be judged not by the letter of the Law, but rather with the spirit of grace, mercy and forgiveness. Something more to ponder as we continue to make our journey toward the manger.
