Two-Way Streets

One of the "basics" we are getting "back to" in our new sermon series ("Back to the Basics") is the foundational promise in the Old Testament between God and Abraham. Abraham was descended from Adam – nearly 20 generations removed – and once God called Abraham to leave his home and journey to a new land, God and Abraham made promises to each other. In Genesis 12-13, we see God promising Abraham three things. First, God would give Abraham a land in which to live, settle and put down roots. This was the land of Canaan to which God would lead Abraham. Second, God would provide Abraham with a family of descendants who would become the people of God (the children of Abraham). Finally, God would be a God on whom Abraham could rely and depend. God would, in other words, be Abraham's god. In return, God asked for one thing. Fidelity. Loyalty. Abraham, for his part, was to worship <u>only</u> God and not be misled by idols, spirits or any other divinity he might encounter.

In some ways, one might argue the rest of scripture is related back to this promise – the people struggling to worship only God, being tempted to show devotion to many other things *instead of* God; trying to understand the importance we should put to geographical place; and what it means to be a "people of God" and how to interact with those not in the designated community. Equally interesting, however, is the notion that this fundamental promise in scripture is two-way. It is a bi-lateral covenant. Both sides make promises to the other. In contrast, a "unilateral covenant" is one in which only one side makes promises to the other. But scripture shows us very early that the basis of a life-giving relationship are two-way promises. And not surprisingly, when the people in the bible get into trouble, it's because they fail to keep their promises.

And so it is for us today as well. All meaningful, life-giving, spiritually-fulfilling relationships involve two-way promises. Relationships of oppression, abuse, manipulation etc. are those that lose the two-way nature of the promising. One side fails to keep their promises, forcing the other to do more and suffer more for the relationship to continue. Consider that in marriage *both* bride and groom make public promises to each other, and how silly (even frightening?) it would be if only one promised "to have and to hold" while the other did not. Similarly, when friendships, marriages, and relationships of all kinds break down it can be traced to the perception (and possibly the reality) that one of the two parties is doing work not matched by the other.

God clearly values mutuality – sharing the responsibility for making the relationship work. God is thoroughly invested in us and our lives, but desires that we be equally invested in God and what God desires and values. When we are holding up our end of the bargain, we thrive. When we don't, we should not be surprised when we suffer and struggle in our day to day living. And God values mutuality in the relationships that we build with one another. That's why six of the first 10 commandments (Exodus 20:1-17) have to do with how we treat each other. When our earthly relationships reflect the relationship God modeled with Abraham – when they are two-way streets – we will thrive and flourish in the love and care we experience with one another, just as God intended.
