

# **About Today's Music**

The hymns this morning are strongly associated with Martin Luther. In 1517, Luther posted a compilation of criticisms of certain practices of the Roman Catholic Church he did not believe were supported by scripture. When he refused to withdraw these "95 theses", he was excommunicated and condemned to death as a heretic. His life was spared when Prince Frederick the Wise arranged for Luther to be kidnapped and taken to safety in the Prince's fortified castle. According to tradition, it is there that he wrote the masterful hymn, "A Mighty Fortress is Our God." Note the imagery that reflects his surroundings and his present situation in life. Beyond all that he is faithful to his belief in God forever.

"From Heaven Above" is a Christmas hymn that Luther wrote for use with his own family on Christmas Eve. The original had fifteen stanzas and was divided between soloist and the children.

The hymn "All My Hope in God is Founded", although written a hundred years after Luther, has strong resemblance to his teaching. God's strength and faithfulness is to be trusted above the earthly structures we might build for ourselves.

"This is a Day of New Beginnings" reminds us that, even though the past is good for instruction in God's love and design for the human experience, the gospel story is ever new. We live out the gospel in ever changing scenarios, but we are continually drawn to the table where God's love is always present and available for us.
